What is the P&C Association?

A Parents and Citizens' Association (P&C) is a group of community minded people — parents and citizens — who take on a more formal role to assist the school in providing:

- Feedback on school policies and activities
- Additional resources to be used to enhance student learning
- Parents with opportunities to be involved in their child's education.

Role of the P&C Association?

The principal is the site manager for the school and acts as the representative for the Minister of Education.

The P&C Association is there to work with the principal and the school community in a productive partnership, to achieve the best possible outcomes for students of the institution.

It is not the role of the P&C Association to interfere in the daily running of the school, which is the responsibility of the principal.

Functions of the P&C Association (from the P&C Model Constitution)

- To foster community interest in educational matters.
- To encourage closer cooperation between the parents of students attending the school, other members of the community, staff and students of the school.
- To provide advice and recommendations to the principal of the school on issues and concerns in respect of students and the general operation and management of the school.
- To provide or assist in the provision of financial or other resources or services for the benefit of students of the school.

Schools have their own budgets — but invariably they need more than the budget allows. That's where the P&C becomes a really valuable partner.

One of the major functions of the P&C is to raise money through various fundraising events held throughout the school year. Whether that be a good old fashioned sausage sizzle or cake sale, or our well known major fundraising event the "Wingello Spring Fling".

Fundraising is a powerful way in which to help our school get much-wanted additional resources — from extra library books, playground improvement and development, to assist in funding extra classes such as music lessons.

All money raised by the P&C is used for the benefit of the school. But as a member, you get to vote on how funds are used — and ultimately, that can benefit your child too.
